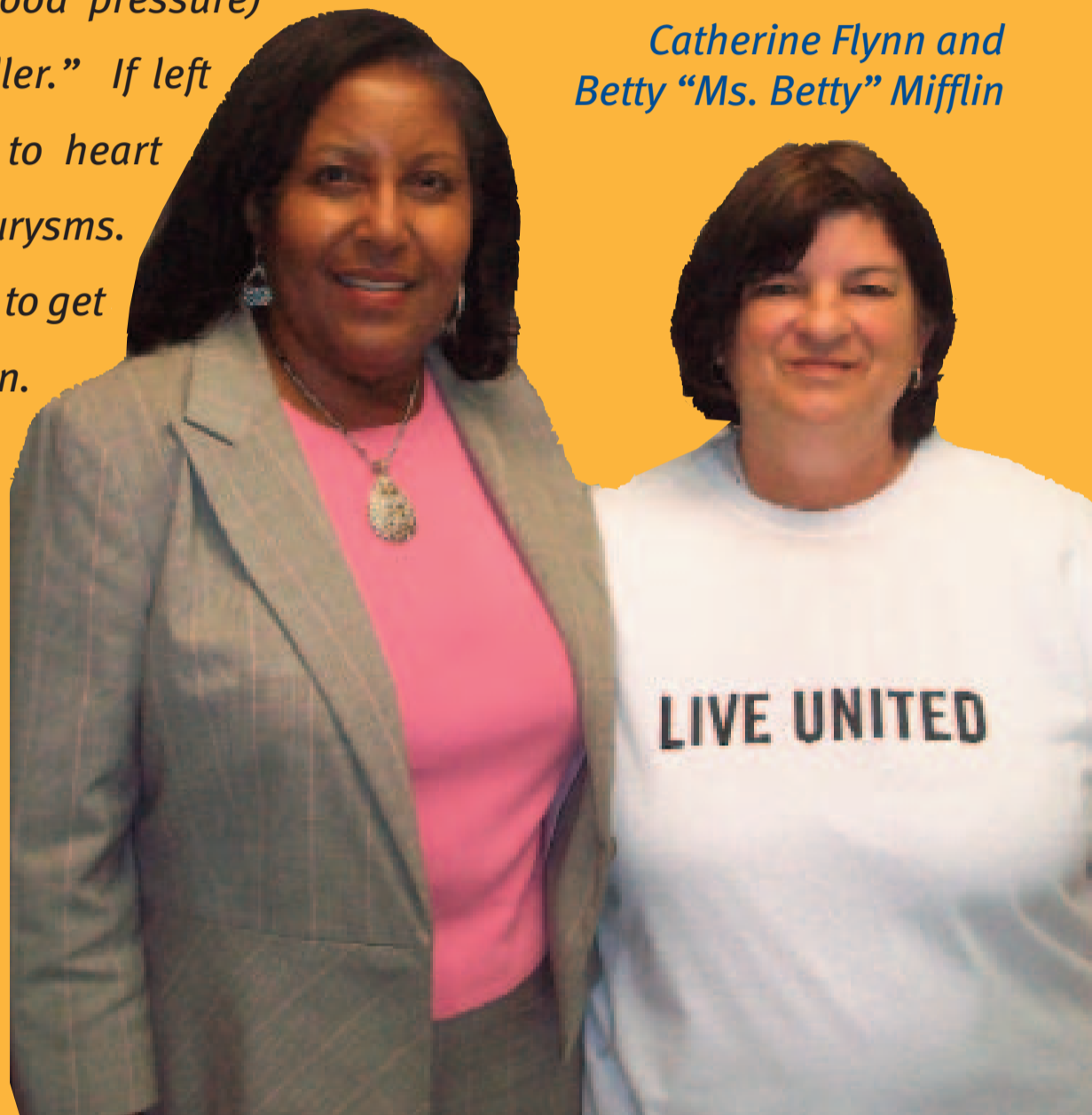

Catherine Flynn first came to the Houston County Volunteer Medical Clinic eight years ago. She works at a daycare in Houston county that does not provide insurance or any other benefits. Catherine has hypertension (high blood pressure) which is referred to as the “silent killer.” If left untreated, her condition could lead to heart damage, stroke, kidney failure and aneurysms. Without the clinic she would not be able to get her medication to treat her hypertension. “If not for Houston County Volunteer Medical Clinic, I would not know what to do. The clinic and staff are a lifeline to me. When my father passed away Ms. Betty was one of the first people I opened up to and talked to. She has taken care of me for so long that to her I am more than a patient and to me she is more than my care manager.”
